Museum

The Heritage Center received a grant for installation of HVAC at the Cambridge Springs Trolley Station.

There was a nice crowd for the Heritage Center's annual meeting at the trolley station. The speaker was the president of the Cambridge Springs Historical Society, Mr. Richard Docter.

A court appointment was scheduled for June 20, 2014 to file for the funds from the Towney estate.
